A: The OS is stored in the filesystem somewhere at the end of the partition, so you can get to it with `dd if=/dev/diskXsY of=/path/to/os.img bs=512`. If the command works, you can then mount it using `e2fsck -f /path/to/os.img`, then you can mount the part with `mount -o ro,loop /path/to/os.img /mnt` (Replace `/mnt` with the actual mount point, which probably isn't `/` or `/boot`) `sudo dban --pass=/path/to/os.img.txt /dev/sdX`

At this point, you can delete `/dev/sdX` if you wish. (Rough draft)

This isn't a very good idea... The federal government's top civil rights lawyer is refusing to comply with a watchdog's order to investigate a complaint that she has a conflict of interest. In a letter sent to the Office of Government Ethics on Monday, the department's principal deputy solicitor general, Neomi Rao, said she and all of her senior lawyers have a "blind spot" when it comes to a conflict involving one of the cases they've worked on for President Donald Trump. Rao cited a highly anticipated Supreme Court case involving a challenge to Trump's travel ban that is to be argued next term as justification for her refusal to investigate the allegations. "The government's interpretation of the Supreme Court's order in this matter would require the government to consider and assess legal questions of significant import to the Supreme Court — even if the government has publicly stated in multiple ways that the subject of the government's challenge at the Supreme Court does not pertain to the government's litigation position," Rao wrote in her letter. "The government's reading of the order in this matter would require the government to evaluate the merit of legal arguments and theories that the government would not otherwise be required to consider
